JOHN CARL WEST

Distinguished Attorney

Statesman

Loyal Alumnus

A distinguished alumnus of The Citadel, he has served his native South Carolina in such vital areas as education, industry, and government.

In World War II, he attained the rank of major and was awarded the Army Commendation Medal. After returning to civilian life in 1946 he attended law school at the University of South Carolina, graduating *magna cum laude* in 1948 and a member of Phi Beta Kappa.

In 1954, in 1958, and again in 1962, he was elected to the South Carolina Senate, where much of his time was devoted to promoting the progress of public school education. Committees of which he has been chairman have influenced improvements in curricula, technical education, and the training of nurses.

A high-minded and humanitarian concern for all aspects of this state characterizes his political career. In 1959 he was chairman of a committee appointed to study the needs of the State Development Board. In 1966 he headed a committee to study the State Constitution, and in 1967, while Lieutenant Governor, he served as Vice President of the Southern Region of the National Conference of Lieutenant Governors. In 1968 he was chairman of the Governor's Advisory Committee on World Trade, and in 1969 chairman of the Governor's Advisory Committee on Housing.

In recognition of his service to his state and devotion to his Alma Mater, The Citadel confers upon him the degree of Doctor of Laws.

GEORGE B. WESTON, JR.

Engineer

Humanitarian

Public Servant

Shortly after graduating from The Citadel in 1926, he began a forty-year career with the Corps of Engineers, twenty-five of those years as Chief of the Engineering Division, Mobile District.

The remarkable versatility of his professional expertise is revealed in the diversity and complexity of the engineering projects which he successfully completed. In civil construction programs he has become a notable expert in the utilization of water resources, being responsible for feasibility studies, design, and construction of hydroelectric, navigation, and flood-control projects in several states. In construction for the Army and Air Force he has been responsible for hospitals, aircraft facilities, ordnance plants, and depots and many special purpose facilities. Particularly challenging were projects for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, which involved complex and unprecedented missile test facilities for Nike-Zeus and the huge Saturn V moon rocket.

Matching his skill as an engineer is his leadership and managerial ability. As Chief, Engineering Division, he directed the work of some five hundred seventy subordinates and earned numerous commendations for his efficiency, flexibility, and sound judgment.

The United Nations recognized his talents and his generosity when it utilized him as director for a flood control project in the Philippines. And the Army recognized his significant efforts to alleviate human suffering in the wake of hurricane Camille.

In acknowledgement of these splendid achievements in his profession, The Citadel is proud to confer upon him the honorary degree of Doctor of Engineering.

The career of Thomas Calvin Stevenson is one of distinguished service to his nation, his state, and his community.

A 1928 graduate of The Citadel, he served in the United States Navy during World War II and rose to the rank of Lieutenant Commander.

Since 1946, as President and Director of Stevenson, Zimmerman Enterprises, he has made significant contributions to the financial and economic growth of the community. He has served as President and as a Director of the Charleston Trident Chamber of Commerce, as a member of the Executive Committee and as a Director of the Charleston Board of Realtors, and as a member, director or officer of numerous real estate, banking, and commercial associations and boards. He is a consistent supporter of The Citadel Educational Foundation and has served as chairman of its annual campaign.

While contributing to his community and his state, he has also helped to preserve our rich heritage, serving as President, as a Trustee, and as a Director of the Historic Charleston Foundation and as a member of the National Trust for Historic Foundation.

He is an Elder of the First (Scots) Presbyterian Church and a Trustee and member of the Advisory Board of the Presbyterian Home of South Carolina.

Born on Edisto Island and receiving his early education there and at the Charleston High School, he attended The Citadel where he received the Bachelor of Arts degree in 1929. He was awarded the Bachelor of Law degree in 1932 by the University of South Carolina. While in Washington, on the staff of the Honorable James F. Byrnes, he continued his study of law at the National University.

His career as a public servant includes his appointment and reappointment as United States District Attorney for the Eastern District of South Carolina, from which position he resigned to devote more of his time to the practice of law. Subsequently he was elected County Attorney and has served continuously as Attorney for County Council since 1958.

In addition to membership in local, state, and National Bar Associations, he was elected a Fellow in the International Academy of Trial Lawyers and subsequently a Fellow in the American College of Trial Lawyers, composed of the upper five per cent of the lawyers of the nation.

His highly valued and continued service to the preservation of the historic buildings in the City of Charleston is attested by his being a charter member of the Board of Trustees of Historic Charleston Foundation and its President for thirteen years.

Finally, he has always been a devoted and loyal alumnus of The Citadel, giving generously of himself and his skills in advising and in legally defending her interests.
