

Harry Arthur Huge is a leader, an advocate, a role model and a philanthropist. From his modest beginnings in Superior, Nebraska, he attended Nebraska Wesleyan University on a basketball scholarship, earning a commission in the U.S. Army Reserve after graduation.

After completing law school at Georgetown University, Mr. Huge began making a name for himself in the legal field, becoming one of the nation's most prominent attorneys. In his career, Mr. Huge has represented victims of asbestos poisoning and families of the victims of the September 11 attacks. He has provided legal counsel to civil rights activists and worked to expose social injustices. Mr. Huge has also provided opportunities for deserving students through a non-profit organization he established with his wife. The Harry and Reba Huge Foundation supports and provides study abroad opportunities for scholars who aspire to be leaders, and The Citadel is fortunate to be one of three institutions of higher education in the United States to partner with the Huge Foundation.
